- a. President's Report Angela
 - i. Priorities list: connecting people.
 - 1. Increase memberships, volunteers, engagement, etc
 - 2. Land swap/retention?
- b. Vice President's Report/Civics Report Lyle
 - i. Rezoning approved
 - 1. next step will be development where we might have limited input
 - ii. New one for QMP RF1
 - iii. Met with Sandra regarding new PRCL building only limited interest i.e. full building only which would require staffing, utilities, maintenance, etc.
- c. Treasurer's Report Shannon

 - ii. Proposed budget from board kickoff (Sept to August fiscal)
 - 1. Spend \$46k including the \$13.5k carryover of the garden from last year
 - 2. Mo may need an allowance for the renaming of the playground, but maybe can't put a sign up until we have a "structure" that then allows us to gain ownership this would need to be captured in the "structure" budget later on

- iii. Starting to host a schedule of typical grants along with other deadlines like fiscal year end, society's annual reports, etc. We can also host all grant applications similarly.
- iv. We have a book-keeper
- v. How do we handle grants? Add to individual budget, or spend less?
- vi. All activities budgeted as full cost unless grant received in advance. Grant funds that come back later should show up in general funds, and then be allocated at discretion of board. Some recognition of those applying for grants should be made in expanding their budget lines upon application to add activities applying for grants is hard work.
- d. Membership Update Cindy
 - i. 54 current active memberships
 - 1. About 30 more received on paper at Big Bin (had 147 last year). Need to start tagging people to get them to re-up.
 - 2. Discounts at City rec centers get a picture of your card from the online Communal system
 - ii. Do we want to have a tablet for use for signup at events?

- i. 23 gardeners have their own plots, and the in-ground for the food bank
- ii. 3 were given up after paying, one of which was converted to potatoes
- iii. Pulling for the food bank Oct 2
- iv. Moved the "print" that was hanging in the tree into the bush. Had a pipe ceremony this year.

f. Social Committee Update – Stephanie

- i. Budget spreadsheets will be updated to close out last year spent \$12,252.00.

h. Sports Director - Mo/Battista

- i. Mo lead, Battista support and happy to promote and run activities at the field level. By the community, for the community, build health and community.
- ii. Have some concrete data from the survey 42 responses, focused on adult, youth, child, and community levels.
- iii. Some start-up costs for equipment, going to do some facility rentals school gym is the best cost option: John McDougall \$21/hr. for school days, \$50/hr. weekends; Central Lions most expensive at \$97/hr. Cheaper option could do a weekly drop-in; more expensive might only be monthly. But monthly might be enough at this time and see if we can build momentum.
 - 1. Soft start in October community walk.
- iv. The city booking portal opens Sept 19 9 am.
- v. Can we link up with other communities like QMP, Blatchford, etc.?
- vi. Playground committee: pretty much done, a few complaints about grass etc.
- vii. We paid for the porta-potty for the green shack.
