## STRENGTHENING YOUR ORGANIZATION & FUNDING RESOURCES

### Personal Information Protection Act

- Have you ever wondered about the rules for collecting personal information of league members?
- The [Personal Information Protection Act](#) (PIPA) is Alberta's private sector privacy law.
- PIPA is consent based and allows organizations to collect personal information for reasonable purposes. It outlines what information organizations may collect, how it is collected, how it can be used and when it is appropriate to disclose.

### Alberta Board Member Essentials - Summer 2019 Session

- The Alberta Board Member Essentials Program (ABME) was built by Albertans for Albertans, and is designed to support the growth of new and developing board members.
- ABME supports your growth in understanding nonprofits – not just from the lens of your organization, but also how you and your organization play a role in the larger social sector ecosystem.
- The full program is five weeks and consists of three online courses and two half-day in-person sessions. Online sessions take on average 3 hours each and are to be completed on the student's own time.
- Please note: Space is limited. Register early.

### Canada's Volunteer Awards

- Do you know a volunteer whose selflessness would be an inspiration to Canadians?
- Nominate them for Canada's Volunteer Awards, which recognizes the contributions of our country's most dedicated volunteers.
- The call for nominations is open until **June 21st**.

## GRANTS

### Youth Environmental Engagement Grants

- The Alberta Emerald Foundation provides micro-grants of up to \$500 to youth-led and youth-targeted environmental projects and initiatives.
- The project or initiative must be led by or targeted to individuals who are aged 25 years and under. Only group projects will be considered.
- Grants are only available for future projects, and cannot be backdated.
- Applications are reviewed on a monthly basis.

### Young Edmonton Grants: Applications Now Open

- The Edmonton Community Foundation has grants available for activities that are initiated, led, and organized by young Edmonton and area residents.
- Ideas and projects of all kinds are supported. The most important consideration is that the applicant is an Edmonton and area resident between the ages of 13 and 24 and is involved in the project's planning and execution.
- The applicant will need to partner with their school or a registered charity.
- Requests can be made for up to \$3,000.
- The next online application deadline is May 15 for projects occurring after July 1.
- Upcoming application deadlines include October 15, 2019 (for projects after December 1, 2019) and February 15, 2020 (for projects after April 1, 2020).

### Rising Youth Micro-grants

- TakingITGlobal (TIG) is looking for young people who are inspired with ideas and ready to take action through youth-led community service grants.
- Next application deadline: **June 30, 2019.**

### Telus Foundation Sponsorships

- Sponsorship proposals are reviewed quarterly in April, July, October and January.
