The deadline to apply for the 2020 Community League Operating Grant is April 30, 2020.

Scotts Gro for Good Grant

Gro for good grants are valued at \$2500 (cash plus in-kind product donation) and will be awarded to selected projects across Canada based on community impact, youth involvement and sustainability. The applicants will need to demonstrate one or more of the following benefits to the community: addressing health & wellness needs, enhancing the environment &/or engaging with youth. **Apply by February 28.**

311 Hours of Operations Change

Effective February 2, 2020 the hours of 311 are being reduced from 24 to 12 hours a day. The new hours are from 7am to 7pm, seven days a week (closed on statutory holidays).

The changes to 311 hours are an effort by Council to deal with reduced revenues and to keep tax increases down for citizens. The compressed schedule will result in a slight increase in wait times.

Support for essential public safety and urgent bylaw calls will continue to be available after hours. Examples include; down trees, manhole cover off on arterial road, sinkholes, dog attack, parking related concerns, etc.
