COVID-19 Service & Program Impacts

Many City programs and services have been adjusted or impacted due to COVID-19 and/or staffing and budget constraints. This search tool is updated regularly to help you and your community stay in the know as the City reopens some programs and services.

Reopening Sport, Playgrounds & Open Spaces

As of May 22, playgrounds, skateparks, tennis, pickleball, volleyball and basketball courts, disc golf, outdoor fitness parks and athletic tracks reopened for safe use. Neighbourhood Services wants everyone to stay safe & healthy during this time of transition. Community League Reopenings

Green Shack Program

Green Shack programming will not be activated for the duration of the summer season. This decision was made as part of the City's strategy to reduce expedictures in response to the COVID-19 crisis and will not be affected by Provincial economic relaunch plans.

Edmonton Valley Zoo- Opens June 15

Tickets are expected to go on sale in early June. Details will be posted on the Zoo's Facebook and Instagram pages, and valleyzoo.ca.

New guidelines to promote safety:

- Advance tickets only, sold online, with a daily attendance limit of 1,500 visitors
- More hand sanitizer locations, including at the entry and exit and throughout the zoo
- One-way traffic around the zoo to facilitate physical distancing and minimize interactions
- Pathway markings, signage or barriers to enforce physical distancing guidelines and hygiene protocols
- Limited food service
- Rides remain closed

On May 19th, rules for temporary patios, sidewalk cafes and outdoor retail operations were revised. This will help businesses increase their space for customers in safe ways, in alignment with Alberta Health guidelines. It will add to the vibrancy of our city this summer and until the end of 2020.
