Festival and Events Micro Grant

The Festival and Events Micro Grant program has been created to support smaller, outdoor community (niche) festivals and events that showcase local talent, celebrate local histories and cultures, and add vibrancy to our City throughout the year.

This program is available to registered not-for-profit, charitable organisations, and business improvement areas. The festival or event must take place by <u>December 31, 2023</u>.

The maximum grant is up to 50% of eligible expenses up to a maximum of \$10,000; the minimum grant amount will be \$500. *Please note that groups are only eligible to receive one of the Festival and Events Micro Grant, Neighbourhood Services Micro Grant, or Neighbourhood Connections grant for a single event.

The deadline to apply is **April 30**. Visit the website for more information.

Phasing out Single Use Plastic

An estimated 450 million single-use items are thrown in the garbage each year in Edmonton, and even more are recycled and littered. Edmonton's Single-use Item Reduction Bylaw (20117) aims to reduce this amount by 20% over the next four years.

The bylaw makes reusable options easier to use and access and eliminates the use of plastic shopping bags and styrofoam containers. For a full breakdown of the bylaw, you can visit edmonton.ca/SingleUse.

- Be a leader and bring reusable cups, bags and accessories with you when you shop or get takeout food and drinks;
- Share information about the bylaw with friends and family, and point them to edmonton.ca/SingleUse if they have questions;
- Stay engaged with news on the bylaw by following the City of Edmonton on Twitter and Facebook, and liking, commenting and sharing posts about the bylaw.
