| News and Updates | Carbon Monoxide Awareness Week runs from<br>November 1 - 7. This odourless and colourless gas is a<br>result of the incomplete combustion of fuels. At this time<br>of year, the weather is becoming colder and we are<br>turning to heating appliances to keep our homes warm.<br>Be aware of the symptoms of carbon monoxide poisoning:<br>- Dizziness<br>- Headache<br>- Nausea<br>- Fatigue<br>- Burning eyes<br>- Vomiting<br>- Loss of muscle control<br>Make sure your home has working carbon monoxide and<br>smoke alarms:<br>- Test both smoke alarms and carbon monoxide (CO)<br>alarms monthly to ensure they are working properly.<br>- Replace batteries at least once a year; never remove the<br>batteries or disable alarms.
