The City of Edmonton is introducing a <u>Single-use Item Reduction Bylaw (20117)</u>. With the help of businesses and residents, we can reduce litter and waste sent to the landfill.

Bylaw requirements as of July 1, 2023

- Single-use plastic shopping bags can no longer be distributed.
- Businesses must charge at least 15 cents for paper shopping bags (increasing to 25 cents on July 1, 2024).
- Businesses must charge at least \$1 for new reusable shopping bags (increasing to \$2 on July 1, 2024).
- Styrofoam cups, plates, bowls, containers, etc. can no longer be used.
- Businesses may only provide accessories (like straws, condiment packets, cutlery and napkins) if a customer requests them.
- Accessories can also be provided at a self-serve station.
- Businesses must have and follow a policy for accepting customers' reusable cups.
