Outdoor Amenity Licensing

Community Leagues that would like to utilize open space parkland (not licensed land) for winter amenities must apply for these permits by September 15, 2023.

For snowbank ice rinks that will be larger than 1579m2, for any snowbank ice rinks that propose amenities (seating, lighting, rink boards, fencing, netting, etc) and for all ice trails a license agreement from Parkland Management is required. These license agreements are issued at the discretion of Parkland Management and Parks Operations. Snowbank ice rink or ice trail license agreements issued by Parkland Management are subject to fees. These fees are for the repair and restoration of parkland within the snowbank or ice trail license area. These fees will be determined after the application is made as the fees are based on the specific application details. Questions can be directed to: prsparklandmanagement@edmonton.ca

Effective June 1, some changes to food and beverage eligibility in the Neighbourhood Services Funding Program (NSFP) grants take effect.
