Setting up a Farmers Market

If you as the league want to be a farmers market, you will need to arrange certification with the province. It's easier if you plan on being a public market. You will need to follow the same restrictions as what's found in the business licensing info but don't require the business licence itself. For either option, you will also need to inform Parkland Management that a market is occurring and that it is operated solely by the league. If you are looking to hire a third party to run things for you, the process changes. Let me know if that's the case and I can send you that information

NEW! Important 2022 -2023 Neighbourhood Connections and Micro Grants Funding Update

The 2022 Neighbourhood Services funding program had a milestone year in supporting community groups. We received a significant increase in Neighbourhood Services Funding applications from previous years to enhance several events, initiatives and programs to increase neighbourhood connections. Please note that the 2022 Neighbourhood Services-Micro and Connections Grants program is now closed. Applications for 2022 funding will no longer be accepted. As we transition to Fall, there are a lot of cozy ways to celebrate the change in seasons! As part of your event planning, please remember to submit your license application *4 weeks ahead*. This will ensure

enough time to obtain activity specific permissions such as fire works, vending, alcohol or noise. We look forward to supporting you to host a successful event!

NEW DEADLINE! Community Safety and Wellbeing Funding Program

The City of Edmonton offers a new funding opportunity to support community organizations in the advancement of community safety and well-being (CSWB). Community organizations can apply for up to \$100,000 in one-time grant funding for work to make Edmonton safer and more inclusive. The new deadline for <u>applications</u> is **September 30th.**. Up to \$1.5 million is available for initiatives that address emergent community needs or opportunities, can be completed within the next 24 months, and align with the CSWB Strategy outcomes. Alcohol in Parks Survey

Boulevard Gardens!

Edmontonians can add character and vitality to their neighbourhoods by creating boulevard gardens to transform underutilized space into vibrant streetscapes. Boulevard gardens promote community pride, ecological diversity and climate resilience.

ETS Fall Service Changes began September 4th

September is the busiest time of year for transit riders. With many people returning to school and work, riders are encouraged to plan their trips in advance. On Sunday, September 4, Edmonton Transit Service (ETS) fall service changes will be in effect. Some of the adjustments riders will see include the return of school special routes and trips, increased frequency on many regular bus routes, the start of transit service at the new Davies Transit Centre and a high frequency express service between Mill Woods and downtown. **visit** edmonton.ca/TransitAlerts and edmonton.ca/OnDemandTransit.
