News & Updates	Updates to Parkland Permitting - New Public Space Bylaw The City passed the Public Spaces Bylaw in February of 2025 and it will come into effect on May 12, 2025. The following updated information is for community leagues and other event organizers hosting outdoor events on community league licensed land or open City parkland. When do I need a Neighbourhood Event License? Do I Need a Neighbourhood Event License?.pdf -Events held within the community league hall and attached patio do not require a Neighbourhood Event License. Other bylaws may apply. -Vehicles entering / remaining on parkland require a Vehicle Parkland Access Permit even if the event itself does not require a Neighbourhood Event License. Questions? News & Updates	Housing Information Sessions As we head into the spring construction season, you may see new and different types of housing in your neighbourhood, including triplexes, rowhouses or backyard housing, that have been enabled by the updated zoning bylaw. The City's Zoning Bylaw sets the rules for where new buildings should go, what types of buildings they can be and what types of businesses and activities can happen on a property.	
	The City is hosting drop-in information sessions in May where you can learn more about the rules that allow these types of housing under the Residential Small Scale (RS) zone. City staff will be available to answer your questions. The City is also working to increase access to affordable housing in all areas of Edmonton. City staff will be available to answer questions about City-led affordable or supportive housing developments.	
	It is important to note that this is not a public engagement event. The City is not collecting feedback on the zoning bylaw or specific developments at this event.

Examples of text for use on social media:

ETS wants everyone to feel safe every time they board a bus or train. ETS takes a multi-layered approach to safety and security, and staff in our Control Centre monitor transit service 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Text or call Transit Watch to report harassment, disorder or suspicious behaviour.

ETS's Transit Watch program is one way riders can report safety concerns, like harassment, disorder or suspicious behaviour, directly to ETS staff in the Control Centre. Call or text Transit Watch at 780-442-4900, anytime.

To discreetly report immediate safety concerns to ETS staff, any time of day, text Transit Watch at 780-442-4900.

Please provide detail in your text message - for example: Are you on a bus? Which bus? Are you on a train? What LRT station is coming up next? What is the situation? Specifics are important.

The text message will be received by ETS staff in the Control Centre, and they will respond to you as quickly as possible.
